Freddie and Miarose competed in the Derbyshire County Championships Long Course Finals at Moorways in Derby over the past two weekends. Freddie came away with gold, silver and bronze medals and Mia Rose won a silver.

Fred is now the County Champion in 1500m freestyle (60 lengths of Buxton Pool). The distance is so long that the timekeepers put numbers in the pool so swimmers know how many lengths there are left to go. Miarose won a silver in the 400m freestyle final, an amazing achievement for her first Long Course finals. Simply qualifying for the County Championships requires swimmers to achieve demanding qualification times during the season, so competing and winning medals is a wonderful achievement and reflects Freddie and Miarose's hard work and commitment.
